The anticipated reinstatement of the <u>Global Gag Rule</u> will undermine access to essential care, leaving countless individuals without the resources they need. This latest challenge is just one of many that we have overcome for more than three decades. This partnership will include the distribution of free contraceptive services and products and comprehensive healthcare provider training sessions. Through expanding access, SIDA and DKT Myanmar are helping to alleviate the socio-economic pressures of unplanned pregnancies in Myanmar's most vulnerable communities.

## DKT grows the total IUD market

DKT continues to scale up global access to affordable LARCs.

As the **sole importer of copper IUDs in Nigeria**, <u>DKT</u> has played an important role in increasing access to long-acting reversible contraceptives in the country. The recently released <u>RHSC Family Planning Market Report</u> found that in 2024 there was a significant increase in copper IUD procurement in Nigeria, 600,000 units —three times the number from previous years. DKT remains steadfast in empowering both the public and private sectors to secure contraceptive products, broadening women's choices, and transforming access to high-quality, affordable reproductive healthcare.

Additionally, in 2024, <u>DKT WomanCare</u> and <u>Medicines360 partnered to distribute Avibela</u>, an innovative lower-cost hormonal IUD that provides up to eight years of pregnancy prevention and can help manage heavy menstrual bleeding. This partnership focuses on addressing the needs of women in low-resource settings across Africa, Asia, Central America, and the Caribbean.

As a member of the <u>Hormonal IUD Access Group</u>, DKT collaborates with governments to introduce and scale up access to hormonal IUDs. In December 2024, representatives from 19 countries met to discuss strategies for improving awareness, increasing demand, and strengthening partnerships to support greater access to hormonal IUDs. Through these initiatives, DKT positively impacts women across the world with greater knowledge of and access to reproductive health products.

# Increasing sustainability through provider training sessions that lead to long-term change in Pakistan and Ghana



In <u>Pakistan</u>, the <u>Dhanak Health Care Centers</u> network—a system of over 1,000 clinics—has improved access to affordable, high-quality family planning (FP) services. These clinics are managed by dedicated community midwives who prioritize providing essential healthcare to their communities. Hear from Shazia Munir in Morangabad, Gujranwala, Punjab, and Madiha Munsif in Dhilanwali, Gujranwala, Punjab, as they share how the specialized training they've received from DKT Pakistan has enabled them to offer more comprehensive services. Their efforts have significantly enhanced the well-being of their communities by expanding access to crucial health services.



Similarly, in Ghana, <u>DKT Anglophone West Africa (AWA)</u> is building local capacity and driving innovation through training sessions on DMPA-SC, a self-injectable contraceptive. In November 2024, a comprehensive session focused on the proper administration techniques for DMPA-SC and effective client counseling. 44 participants gained practical, hands-on experience, equipping them to deliver innovative contraceptive services. This initiative is expanding access to essential reproductive healthcare across Ghana, ensuring more individuals can benefit from these vital services.
